

Disaster supply kit

Food - at least enough for 3 to 7 days. Non-perishable packed or canned food and juices. Non-electric can opener, cooking tools / fuel / paper plates / plastic utensils.

Blankets / Pillows

Clothing / rain gear / sturdy shoes

First aid kit / medicines / prescription drugs

Special items for babies and the elderly

Toiletries / hygiene items / moisture wipes

Flashlight with extra batteries

Battery operated radio and NOAA weather radio

Cell phone with car charger

Cash (small bills) credit cards. Banks and ATM may not be available for extended periods

Keys

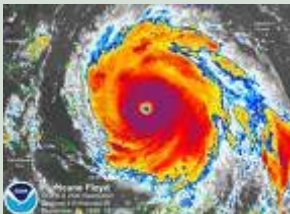
Toys, books and games

Important papers in a water proof container—insurance, medical records, bank account numbers, Social Security card, etc.

Tools— keep a set with you during the storm

Fill your vehicle fuel tank

Pet care items—proper identification / immunization records / medications. Ample food and water— carrier cage— muzzle and leash



FAMILY DISASTER PLAN

Discuss the type of hazards that could affect your family. Know your homes vulnerability to storm surge, flooding and wind.

Locate a safe room or safest area in your home for each hurricane hazard.

Determine escape routes from your home and places to meet.

Have an out-of-state friend as a family contact, so all your family members will have a single point of contact.

Have a plan for your pets if you have to evacuate.

Post emergency numbers by your phone and make sure your children know how to call 911.

Check your insurance coverage.

Stock non-perishable emergency supplies and a Disaster Supply Kit.

Use NOAA weather radio. Remember to have replacement batteries.

Have a fully stocked first aid kit.

Gasoline and diesel may be in short supply before and after a hurricane. Fill your gas cans now while supply is plentiful. Store petroleum products in a safe place away from flames such as pilot lights. You can always use the gas or diesel when hurricane season is over.

When the storm has passed use your phone to find stores that have gas. Supply may be short for days.

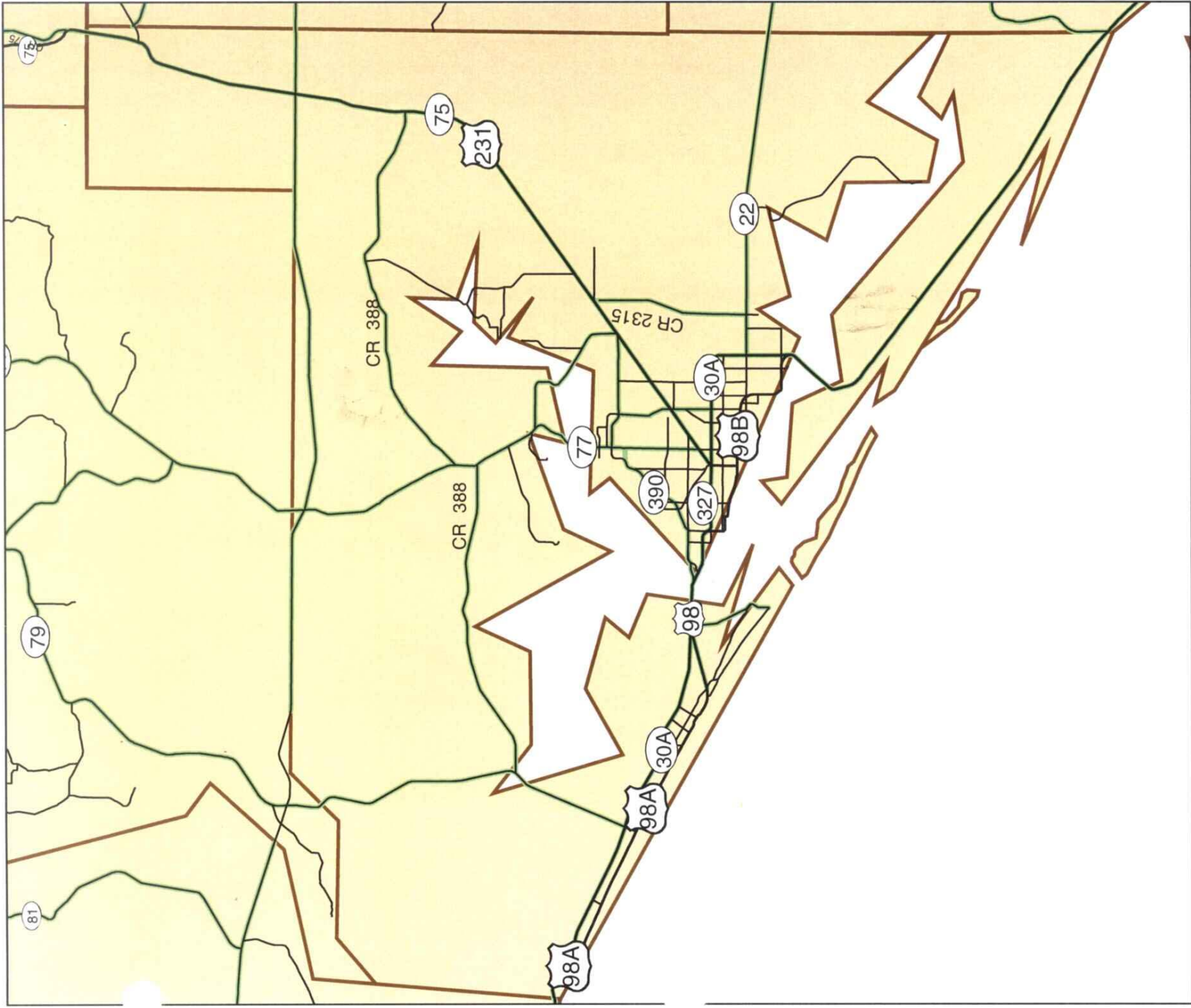
ARE YOU READY? YOUR GUIDE TO HURRICANE SURVIVAL
